

FAQs – Corporate Mentoring with IntoUniversity

What is the time commitment?

You will support a young person for 18 months as they complete their final year studies at college and make the transition to university. During the first stage you will commit to meeting your mentee once a month. Once they begin university you will begin an e-mentoring programme and contact your mentee by email at least once a month over the course of their first term.

When would I meet up with my mentee?

Our centres are open from 3.30pm-6pm every weekday during term-time for mentoring meetings. Subject to a DBS check, you will also be able to organise some out-of-centre meetings such as inviting your mentee to your place of work or visiting a university together. You and your mentee will decide on meeting dates and times.

What activities could I do with my mentee?

Mentors will support mentees in areas such as choosing the university and the course that is right for them, writing their personal statement, planning and accessing finance, thinking about the different academic demands of university life, and developing independent living skills.
